Law Week in Australia is dedicated to raising awareness and understanding of the law. It promotes legal education for the wider community, and how you can get access to legal services and advice.

To celebrate **Law Week 2023 (May 15-19)**, Legal Aid WA invites students in Years 3- 12 to create a short video (1-2 minutes) on one of the following topics;

- What does Legal Aid do?
- What is something young people should know about to avoid getting in trouble with the law?
- What is a legal problem that might affect you and what you can do about it?

With the support of their teacher/s, students will research the topics and create the video during school times. Students may use various forms of technology, school approved software or apps. Depending on the teacher's discretion and student's creativity, the videos may or may not include the students faces showing in them.

The videos will be shared to us through a secure cloud-based server. No one apart from your child's school teacher and our Community Legal Team (who is facilitating this challenge) at Legal Aid WA, will be able to access the videos.
