From our **R U Legal?** program you may already know that the age of criminal responsibility in WA is 10 years.

This means that if you are 10 or older and you commit a criminal offence, you can be charged by the police and convicted in court. This is where the challenge comes in!

Task: Use the information on our website to create a short video (1-2 minutes) on **one** of the following topics:

- What does Legal Aid do?
- What is something young people should know about to avoid getting in trouble with the law?
- What is a legal problem that might affect you and what you can do about it?

Who can enter: Students in Years 3-12, with the support of their classroom teacher.

How: You can use any type of technology, app or software to record your video. Once you have created your video, your teacher will share it with us.

Dates: Entries close on Thursday 11 May, 4.00pm.

Prize: The videos will be judged by our expert lawyers, and the winners will be featured on Legal Aid WA's official social media pages!
