Care Plans



Every child on a time limited protection order or an until 18 protection order must have a care plan.



A care plan is a written document made by Child Protection.

It sets out the needs of your child and a plan for how your child's needs will be met.



After a child is put on a time limited protection order or an until 18 protection order a care plan should be made within **30** working days.

There will be a care plan meeting to talk about what will go in the care plan.

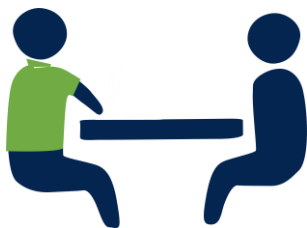
You should go to the care plan meeting so you can have a say in your child's care plan.



You should be given a copy of the care plan after the care plan meeting.



A care plan should be checked at least once every 12 months to see if it is still working well for your child.
